THE FOUNDATION

The genesis of YPS, as a matter of fact, lies in the Aitchison College, Lahore (the only Public School in Pre-Partition Punjab), and it plays a great role in the making of our school.

Aitchison was a college not for all, but only for scions of princes, lords and aristocrats. His Highness the late Maharajadhiraj Yadavindra Singh of Patiala, from whose august name this school derives its significance,





was too a student of this college and later a member of its Board of Governors. He was against restrictions in admission of boys to Aitchison College and had an idea of opening a public school at Patiala which would be open to all, irrespective of caste, creed or colour.

August 1947 came, the time which witnessed the worst bloodshed of the era. The parents of the boys from Patiala and His Highness' own contemporaries appealed to His Highness to give shape to his old idea of starting a public school in Patiala. The generous, bountiful and benign ruler of Patiala, who had always taken keen interest in the education of the youth of this country, promptly agreed.

On 11th October, 1947, the late Rai Bahadur Dhani Ram Kapila, one of the old teachers of His Highness and the Headmaster of Aitchison College, was brought to Patiala from Ludhiana under military escort. On 12th October, a six member committee was appointed to explore the possibilities of founding the public school in Patiala.

On 30th October, 1947, the Maharaja of Patiala, members of the Committee and departmental heads visited the stadium and Exhibition Grounds to select the site for the school and for a temporary building for the boarding house. The Yadavindra Stadium was made available for classroooms and Bhupindra Kothi for the boarding house.

On 2nd February, 1948, the school started functioning with a meagre strength of 21 students and 9 teachers, with Rai Bahadur Dhani Ram Kapila as the Principal. The school was an improvement on Aitchison College in that there was no social restriction on the admission of students. Anyone without any prejudice to race, belief or faith could join the school.

In 1950, YPS attended the India Public Schools' Conference and was elected a member of the Conference. The same year some personal reasons led to Rai Bahadur Dhani Ram Kapila relinquishing his charge of the school Principal. On 18th September, 1950, Lt. Col. Frank Von Goldstein took over as the second Principal of the school. From a small beginning, the school continued to grow steadily; and now it had more boys on the rolls than there was room for, with still more clamouring for admission.

In 1954, the school was made coeducational; with the number of students still increasing, the school had to build more accommodation and increase the number of playing fields. The existing boarding house facilities were expanded and a third boarding house was opened in 1953. In 1957, His Highness the Maharaja of Patiala placed the Lal Bagh at our disposal. For playing fields, we leveled the areas between the boarding houses and the stadium. Renovated, furbished and embellished, the school now presents an attractive look. After facing difficulties with courage and confidence for over 70 years, YPS has now established it self as one of the leading public schools in the country.

The school crest bears the motto, "VIDYA VINAY VEERTA" - WISDOM, HUMILITY, VALOUR. The school pays a lot of attention to character building and sports activities as part of education.

In 1973, the school celebrated its Silver Jubilee. There were 550 students on roll with 40 teachers on strength. At its Golden Jubliee, in 1998, it had maintained its growth, with over 1500 and 100 faculty members, while progressing towards excellence in all fields of education.


The year 2022 saw YPS, Patiala celebrating its platinum jubilee at the completion of its 75 glorious years.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES


The School aims at an all-round development of the boys and girls-physical, emotional and intellectual-with consciousness of social obligations. Indian art, culture, music, dance and languages, yoga, computer literacy form the hard core of a finished personality. 10 years of general education are followed by 2 years of preparation, leading to Engineering, Medicine, Commerce and other Institutes of higher learning.

The aim of the school is to impart an

all-round education, so as to equip the students mentally, morally, physically and culturally to become worthy citizens of free India and enable them to zealously guard and retain its noble traditions. The school strives to develop initiative and leadership. The school aims at disciplined students, educated in mind, body and spirit, and hence best suited to serve their country, and best-fitted to lead others by their example.







CAMPUS

The Yadavindra Sports Stadium is part of The Yadavindra Public School which is spread on 46 acres. It is located four kms from the Patiala Railway Station and the Bus Terminal. The main teaching block is a princely structure with a built-in stadium, providing a 400m track, a velodrome and multipurpose facilities. It has smart board equipped classrooms, extensive playgrounds for 22 sports disciplines wellequipped laboratories, a well-stocked library, a music room, 4 computer labs which include English and mathematics labs. There is a swimming pool with a filtration plant. Four Boarding Houses, a School Hospital and Staff Quarters on the campus are architecturally designed similar to the stadium. There are, at present, 1400 boys and girls on the rolls. Of these, 200 are boarders. The school has three Houses-Mohindra, Dhani Ram and Phulkian, besides a Holding house for junior school boys and a Girls' boarding house with an independent setup. Each House has its own common room and dormitories. All children dine in the Central Dining Hall. The boarding house has a modern Kitchen and fully automated laundry.

ACADEMICS

The most quick and strong assertion a school makes of its priorities is in the form of the ever-so-important studies-unarguably, the most visible face of an educational institution. The school has been maintaining its impeccable repute of being a seat of high-learning and academic excellence through its remarkable results achieved in the ICSE and the ISC examinations, year after year. The school, at present, boasts of an impressive strength of over a hundred faculty members, all highly qualified and proficient in their job. To facilitate this process of learning and provide the right and conducive atmosphere, the school has large, airy and well-ventilated

classrooms, a well-stocked library judiciously fitted with the internet facility.

Keeping pace with the times and the changing face of education , all classes in the school are smart classrooms with interactive boards installed in all. The digital technology makes the teaching —learning process more engaging and helps in a more easy and effectual comprehension of the lessons .

The school strives to keep academics in the foremost echelons of its curriculum, even while effectively supplementing it with other extra-curricular activities.





An independent building for the Junior School came up in the year 1990. The facilities consist of 26 classrooms, 6 multipurpose rooms in the basement, an open-air auditorium and rooms for the offices and the staff.



FACILITIES

COMPUTER CENTRE

Computer Education in YPS is conducted under the "Computer Literacy Programme." There are separate labs for the Junior and Senior School. The Junior School laboratory is equipped with Multimedia kits. All the computers have the latest operating systems. This is to develop the interest of children, thus preparing them to face today's competitive world.



The Computer Centre is increasingly utilised not only to teach computer subject, but also for learning Mathematics and English, which is more user-frienldy. The school is also linked with Internet and e-mail facilities. Lately, the school has introduced the new, advanced computer-aided education as a part of its education programme, in which the state-of-the-art interactive board will make the process of learning far more easy and effective.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE, ROBOTICS AND MATHEMATICS LABORATORY

YPS has set up an English Language, Robotics and a Mathematics Laboratory equipped with modern learner centred software to improve the students' proficiency, improve their skills and further their interest in these subjects.





STAFF

The Staff consists of well qualified faculty and professionals, most of whom have long experience of working in Public schools and as such are efficient and experienced to improve and maintain the standards of a good public school.

PREFECTS' BODY

The body assists the school administration in the day to day running of the school and in organising various inter-house activities. The prefectorial system also inculcates qualities of character and discipline in the students and promotes leadership abilities.

DINING FACILITY



The school runs its own mess, for the boarders in particular, but the day scholars, too are served meals during the winter routine. It is managed by a committee on which the students also have their representation. The meals are served in the Central Dining Hall. The school provides five meals a day-breakfast, 11 o'clock tea/cold drinks, lunch, afternoon tea/cold drinks and supper. The mess caters for both vegetarian and non-vegetrarian meals. Menus are carefully designed to include a wide variety of healthy, sumptuous food to ensure a well balanced diet necessary for the growth of children.
















Since its inception, YPS has been in the forefront in sporting activities among educational institutions in the region. These lay the foundation for the development of an all-round personality, which is an invaluable asset in today's world. Games and Sports teach us tolerance, team spirit, sportsmanship and patience. To achieve this aim, YPS has vast play fields for a large variety of games. These include Hockey, Soccer, Cricket, Tennis, Basketball, Boxing, Shooting and Fencing. We have a well laid out 400M cinder track for athletics in a flood-lit stadium, flood-lit synthetic courts for tennis, cemented courts for basketball, an arena for horse riding, a swimming pool and an under ground 10, 25, 50M Shooting range. In addition to these, there are five smaller grounds for junior boys and girls. 3 world class squash courts have recently been added to the sporting facilities and the construction of a 50m swimming Pool is commencing shortly. Besides Inter-House competitions, the school is in the forefront in organizing All India IPSC Meets as well as participating in them.



One of the most coveted activities during the year for boys and girls of class IV onwards is trekking. This adventure activity is a compulsory part of the school annual curriculum. The treks are usually undertaken in the states of Himachal Pardesh, Uttarakhand and Jammu and Kashmir. Mountaineering expeditions to challenging peaks are also conducted, some recent ones being to Friendship Peak, Norbu Peak (height above 5150 m.) and Mt. Deo Tibba (6001 m.) in the Kullu Manali region.

The aim of the activity besides instilling the spirit of adventure and comradeship, is to inculcate self-confidence and an attitude of self-reliance amongst the students. The excursions also bring them in proximity to Mother Nature and grows in them a feeling of love and affinity for their environment.

Educational tours to various parts of the country and abroad are also carried out during the summer and winter vacations.



The School in keeping with the true ethos of a public school, offers all kinds of cocurricular activities ranging from inter and intra school debates, guizzes and dramatics to other cultural activities like mime competitions and dance. MUN and Round Square conferences form an important part of the school array of activities. The School encourages and stimulates the interest of the students in the field by organising and arranging workshops, seminars and visits by prominent educationists, artistes, celebrities and luminaries from all walks of life. The school now boasts of an 800 seater state of the art auditorium along with an open air amphitheater and an indoor multipurpose hall for the conduct of these activities.





The students' outstanding performances in the fields of academics, sports and co-curricular activities are duly rewarded and recognized through the presentation of awards and scholarships. The school, at present, offers as many as 180 academic awards, 95 sports awards and 20 awards in the field of co-curricular activities, which are formally conferred on the students on important school occasions.



HOBBES YPS has always believed that every child has some talent, which just needs to be discovered and nurtured. So, the school, besides promoting the academic and sports faculties of the child, endeavors to bring to fore and add that extra dimension to a child's personality by offering a wide variety of hobbies which include Cooking, Dramatics, Fine Arts, Music, Dance, Yoga, Robotics, web-designing, 3-D printing and many others. The time well-spent during the hobbies period strives to give pleasure and knowledge in equal proportion to the children and kindle that spark in them which is the fore-runner of all creativity.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES

In today's competitive world, being able to communicate in different languages provides you an edge over the others and enhances your global competency. To upgrade linguistic skills of the students, two new foreign languages - French and Mandarin have been introduced for classes V-X.





Round Square is a world wide association of more than 80 schools on five continents sharing unique and ambitious goals. Students attending Round Square schools make a strong commitment, beyond academic excellence, to personal development and responsibility.

This is achieved by participating in community service, work projects, exchange programmes and adventuring, which can, and often does, take students half way around the world. The school hosts Round Square compounds periodically.

WORKSHOPS, SEMINARS & PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

Workshops, seminars, interactive sessions and other personality development programmes for the students are held throughout the year. Experts and professionals in different fields and walks of life are invited to the school to speak and discourse on matters of educational and general relevance with the students.

Soft skill classes are a compulsory part of the class time table of all students of class I onwards. The aim is to tap the students' talent and hone their personality.

The Career Counselling Workshops are conducted twice a year for all the students of class VIII and above. These counselling sessions help the students channelize their interests, tastes and abilities positively and guide them in making the right choice of careers and professions in lives. The services of renowned counsellors such as Silver Fern Education Consultants and Mindler Pvt. Ltd are sought in this regard. Both face to face and Skype sessions are conducted.

The participation and the engagement of the parents is also sought in the pursuit.




IAYP - INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

To bridge the divide between different cultures, customs and traditions of various countries in this fast changing world and make communication more rapid and frequent, the concept of exchange programme is taken up by the school. International trips and tours are planned and organized to give students an opportunity to participate in workshops on music, drama and sports. Regular exchanges with Aitchison College, Lahore, are an integral part of the school curriculum. The school hosts staff and students from reputed educational institutions abroad annually.



TUCK SHOP

There is a Students's Tuck Shop on the premises, supplying articles of daily use, such as tolletry items and ready made items of clothing, besides serving healthy snacks & drinks.

SCHOOL INFIRMARY

The School has its own infirmary and ambulance manned by a full-time Nursing Sister and a Compounder. A doctor visits the hospital once a day. Serious cases are referred to specialists & Manipal Hospital. Dental and Eye camps are also frequently arranged for the students for regular checkups.





ENVIRONMENTAL SERVING

Keeping in mind the need of the time, our senior students have been actively participating in Environment Awareness programmes. The school is proud of the Environment Club. Its members not only write about the issue but have put up street plays and green marches to spread the message of Environment Conservation.

The School brings out a quarterly newsletter, the "YPS Times", on a regular basis. The school magazine, "The Yadavindrian" and annual creative Journal, 'Athena' are published every year.

THE HOUSE SYSTEM

Every student at YPS belongs to a House and it is central to his/her life at school. We believe that every individual should have the opportunity to flourish in a safe, secure and happy environment, so that, whilst making the transition to adulthood, boys and girls can take advantage of the wealth of opportunities on offer here at YPS.

The pastoral care provided is designed to do this in a friendly atmosphere, encouraging the students to be responsible, courteous, tolerant and supportive of a team of experienced staff consisting of Housemasters and tutors. Every student therefore has access to adults within the House (in addition to the Counseling and School Medical services) to whom he/she can turn for support and advice whenever required.

The students, boarders as well as day scholars, are divided into three Houses namely Mohindra House, Dhani Ram House and Phulkian House.



The boarders reside in the comfortable environs of a three —storeyed residential block fitted with modern state —of- the —art amenities such as mechanized kitchen, bakery and launderette, a central dining hall and air —conditioned dormitories. Girls and junior children live separately in the Girls' Boarding House and the Holding House, respectively.

Effective pastoral care is tendered to the boarder residents to ensure a balanced and harmonious growth of their minds and bodies under the care , supervision and vigil of the staff.

A resident House Matron looks after the boarders' hygiene, clothing and other requirements in each house while the House Masters look after the administrative matters, discipline and closely monitor the overall progress of each child in the House. The House Incharges monitor the participation of the students in Inter-House Activities.

A tutor also interacts with a group of children under his/her care and observes their participation in various activities of the school and takes note of their academic progress. Students are associated with the running of the House by their appointments as House Captains and Prefects.

Students are encouraged to indulge in healthy competition, take pride in doing their own work and grow into mature, independent and self confident individuals. Boarders follow a time-tabled routine, beginning with morning PT, followed by normal school, evening games and supervised prep/study hours.







PRE-ADMISSION INFORMATION

- Boys and Girls are admitted to classes Nursery to III as Day Scholars.
- Admission to the Boarding House starts from Class IV.
- No admissions are made in class X or Class XII.
- Admission given to any student from Nursery to Class V shall be valid up to class V only. Thereafter, the student
 has to seek re-admission in the school as a Boarder for further studies in the school.
- 5. A certain number of students may be readmitted as Day Scholar as per policy of the school from time to time.

ADMISSION TO CLASS XI

The number of seats on offer will depend on availability of vacancies,

- Registration for Provisional Admission to Class XI (Science, Commerce & Humanities) is open for Boarders. Regular classes for class XI usually commence from 15th April.
- Forms for re-admission may be handed in to the Deputy Headmaster in the first week of April of the year of admission.
- All applicants from other schools must appear for the Test before being considered for Provisional Admission.
- Written test will be held in the following subjects:

For Science: English, Science & Maths

For Commerce : English & Maths

For Humanities: English, History & Geography

The following are the marks criteria for re-admission to various streams, obtained in the Pre Board Exam:

- Average of 80% in English, Science (Phy-Chem-Bio), Maths & Computer Science (if opted for in Class X) and an aggregate of 75% for Science Stream.
- Average of 75% in English, Mathematics & Computer Science/Economics/Commerce (whichever opted for in Class X) and an aggregate of 70% for Commerce Stream.
- Average of 65% in English, History, Civics & Geography (HCG), Art/Computer Science/Economics/Commerce (whichever opted for in Class X) and an aggregate of 60% for Humanities.

Admission to all streams will be confirmed only after receipt of the Result Card of Class X (ICSE or CBSE) Final Examinations, The Result Card must be submitted to the School within one week of the declaration of the Board Examination Results.

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION

NOTE:

- These items of clothing must have woven name-tags stitched to them properly.
- Children are not allowed to wear long-sleeve shirts except when blazers are worn. It is therefore advisable to clothe them with half-sleeve shirts throughout the year.
- 3. Parents who wish to order the clothes with the School are advised to do so at least one month before the term starts. The blazer, shorts, shirts, sweater, tie and belt are recommended to be ordered with the School Tailor/Tuckshop. However, parents who wish to get these items from outside are at liberty to do so, provided the cloth and shade is exactly as prescribed. Parents may order the remaining clothes privately.

VISITING HOURS

Parents may visit their wards residing in the Boarding House with the prior permission of the Housemaster. Only two visits are permitted per month, which include taking the ward on an out pass for a local visit.

Visiting hours-(only on Sundays and holidays.) 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m (Summer and Winter) and 4.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. (Summer & Winter)

Hospital visiting hours are-5.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. in Summer and 4.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m in Winter.

LEAVE RULES

Prior application is a must before leave is availed of. In case a student is absent for a period of seven days continuously, without any application having been submitted or prior permission availed of from the Headmaster/ Deputy Headmaster/ Incharge of the Junior School, his/her name will be automatically struck off the rolls. A student missing school without availing prior permission to proceed on leave, will be marked absent for the day. Such absentees will incur a fine of Rs. 50/-(Rupees ten) per day of absence, for the Middle School and Rs. 100/- (Rupees twenty) for classes XI and XII.

Students residing in the Boarding House will observe the following Leave Rules.

- a) Only 2 'Nights Out' will be permitted in a month, of which one can be clubbed with 2" Saturday/week end.
- Visitors may meet their wards on Sunday and holidays during visiting hours.
- c) One 'Day Out' per month will be permitted in addition to the above.

GUARDIANS

Parents must appoint a local guardian for their wards, who may visit them and take them out on leave as per rules.

However, students residing in the Boarding House need not necessarily go out on leave with a local guardian.

PERSONAL EFFECTS

Students are not allowed to keep large sums of money (in excess of Rs. 100/-) with them; any such amounts must be deposited with the Housemaster concerned.

Students are also not allowed to keep any valuables with them. In case of loss of any such item, the school will bear no responsibility under any circumstances.

Carrying or keeping of any Lethal articles is not permitted.

INTERVIEWS

Parents may meet the Director/Deputy Headmaster/Bursar/Incharge Junior School in their offices between 12.00 noon to 1.00 p.m. on any working day by prior appointment. Parents of students residing in the Boarding House must first meet the Housemaster.

FEE (Separate Sheet attached)

Following is the summary of FEE related formalities (Increase in fee shall be Subject to Govt. Regulations)

FEE RELATED FORMALITIES

- At the time of admission, all amounts pertaining to fees shall be deposited. OUTSTATION PARENTS CAN REMIT PAYMENT THROUGH BANK DRAFT/FAVOURING PRINCIPAL, YPS PATIALA, PAYABLE AT ANY BANK IN PATIALA. Cash/cheque will not be accepted.
- After admission, school fee will be paid by online mode. Boarders are required to pay fees on six monthly basis
 (First term by 7th April and Second by 7th October) every year. The Day scholars may, however, pay their fees on
 quarterly basis in advance by 7th day of each quarter. (ie 7th April, July, October and 7th January)
- Late Fee Fine shall be charged after the due date. Names of children who are in debit on the last day of the month shall be struck off rolls. Such students shall have to seek re-admission after payment of re-admission charges Rs. 3000/- along with fees and the fine due.
- Caution money refund/lapse: Caution Money refund must be claimed within three months of the child leaving the school or it will lapse.
- Withdrawal Notice: Notice of withdrawal must be given one month in advance. Failure to do so will entail the payment of one month's fees in lieu of notice.
- No change from Boarder to Day Scholar status will be permitted under any circumstances. A parent wishing to make such change will have to withdraw the child.
- Official transcripts of pass certificate and statement of marks will be provided for submission to various universities on receiving the fees of Rs.1000.


