#### **EVENT 2**




### HISTORY OF YPS IN VERSE- 'SAGAS'

### YPS FLAG FLIES HIGH AT CONSOLATION PEAK (15,000 ft.)

**EVENT 14** 



As a part of the grand celebrations of 'YPS at 75' the students also successfully completed a 10-day mountaineering expedition. A team of 17 students and 2 teachers went for a thrilling adventure from 29th September to 8th October 2022. The team successfully conquered 'The Consolation Peak' with height of 15,000 Ft. The peak is located in the Pir Panjal range of the Himalayas, situated close to Manali, Himachal Pradesh.

During the initial days, the team marched towards their base camp, at Chikka (9700FT). There, the climbers were acclimatized at the Glacier Base camp and

during evening camps. Before the final summit, the climbers also did a crash course in technical mountaineering & Alpine-style climbing techniques. The highly qualified mountaineering instructors also instructed the students about the intricacies of snow & ice craft. In the initial few days, the students trekked for almost 6 hours and covered around 2000 ft. per day. As they approached the final peak, their endurance was tested by different challenges every day. On the final day, the team advanced towards the Consolation Peak by covering 8 hours of

the trek in a straightforward climb with steep slopes of consolidated snow. It was a great opportunity to practice some of the alpine climbing skills on this climb. They finally conquered the peak.

With this successful summit, the YPS climbers have successfully completed two mountaineering expeditions in the year 2022. The first one was the scaling of the 'Friendship Peak' in the month of June. The teams undergo consistent training sessions in school which helps them scale new and challenging heights every time.

### **GRAND MARATHON FOR A GRAND OCCASION**

#### **EVENT 15**

YPS, Patiala organised its first-ever Grand Marathon on Sunday, 20th November, 2022, in Patiala. The idea behind organising this event was to promote fitness amongst students and people of Patiala and to commemorate the school's 75th year of inception. This Marathon was organized in association with 'Fitness Enthusiasts of Patiala' (FEOP). The Grand Marathon included Full Marathon of 42.2 Km, Half marathon of 21 Km, Run of 5 Km and 10 Km, and Fun Run of 2.5 Km. This marathon was open to all and more than 400 people had registered. Col R.P.S Brar, AYOSA President and Prof Dr. Manmohan Singh, famous Cardiologist and former President of Punjab Medical Council, flagged off the enthusiastic runners on Sunday morning.

The 42.2 Km and 21 Km run started at 4:00 am from

Rajindra Gymkhana and Maharani Club, Patiala respectively. The 10 Km, 5 Km and 2.5 Km run started around 8:00 am from YPS Hockey Ground. The finishers were given certificates and prizes at the end of the event.



# YPS PATIALA CONDUCTED THIRD EDITION OF MUN CONFERENCE EVENT 16

MUN provides a wide platform to the students to engage themselves in international discussions and develop their leadership potential. It provides an excellent opportunity to understand the concerns of different countries and gain knowledge about the world.

In a grand opening ceremony, Yadavindra Public School, Patiala began the 3rd edition of Model United Nation Conference 2022 in the campus, on October 6, 2022. The ceremony was held in Captain Amarinder Singh Auditorium of the school. This was one of the mega events which were planned to celebrate 75 years of the school. The ceremony witnessed around 500 attendees which included all the esteemed guests, teachers and student delegates.

This event was organized co-jointly by The Aitchison Yadavindra Old Students Association (AYOSA) and Silver Fern Education Consultants. The event also had the backing of some leading companies of Patiala- Bio Carve Seeds Pvt Ltd, Preet Tractors Pvt Ltd, Nikhalas Institute and Gupta and Son Co. This 3-day long conference included more than 350 student delegates from 30 different schools from all across the country. The theme for the YPS MUN 2022 was 'Tamso Maa Jyotirgamay' - From Darkness to Light. The conference had 10 committees where delegates debated over various international agendas to develop and enhance their diplomatic abilities along the lines of the United Nations. The

MUN Advisors roped in for the event were Ms. Meher Mangat, an alumnus of YPS Patiala and Mr Abhishek Bindal. The two facilitated the structuring of the YPS MUN 2022 model and assisted the teacher coordinators at every step.

The opening ceremony commenced with the arrival of the Chief Guest, Ms. Caroline Rowett, British Deputy High Commissioner. The august gathering included Maharani Preneet Kaur, Member, Lok Sabha, Col R.P.S. Brar, President AYOSA, Prof. Prakash Gopalan, Director, Thapar Institute of Engineering and Technology, Ms. Sakshi Sawhney, DC, Patiala, Ms. Ismat Vijay Singh, SDM, Patiala and distinguished guests from AYOSA. The event proceeded with the Lamp Lighting ceremony followed by the cultural presentation by YPS students. The erstwhile Director, Maj Gen Sanjiv Varma, addressed the gathering and welcomed the guests. The conference was then declared open by Sarvagya Dev Thapliyal, the school Head Boy and the Secretary General of the MUN. The opening video screened on the occasion was praised by one and all.

During the conference, the delegates debated over measures to counter terrorism in the Middle East in UNGA committee; Colonisation of Mars and allocation of resources in UNCOPUS; discussed the plan of action for advancement of women in OIC and many more such serious International issues. 

'Khatda' gone- yet- will live as the one and only one


Your feats are permanent in this life so temporary
