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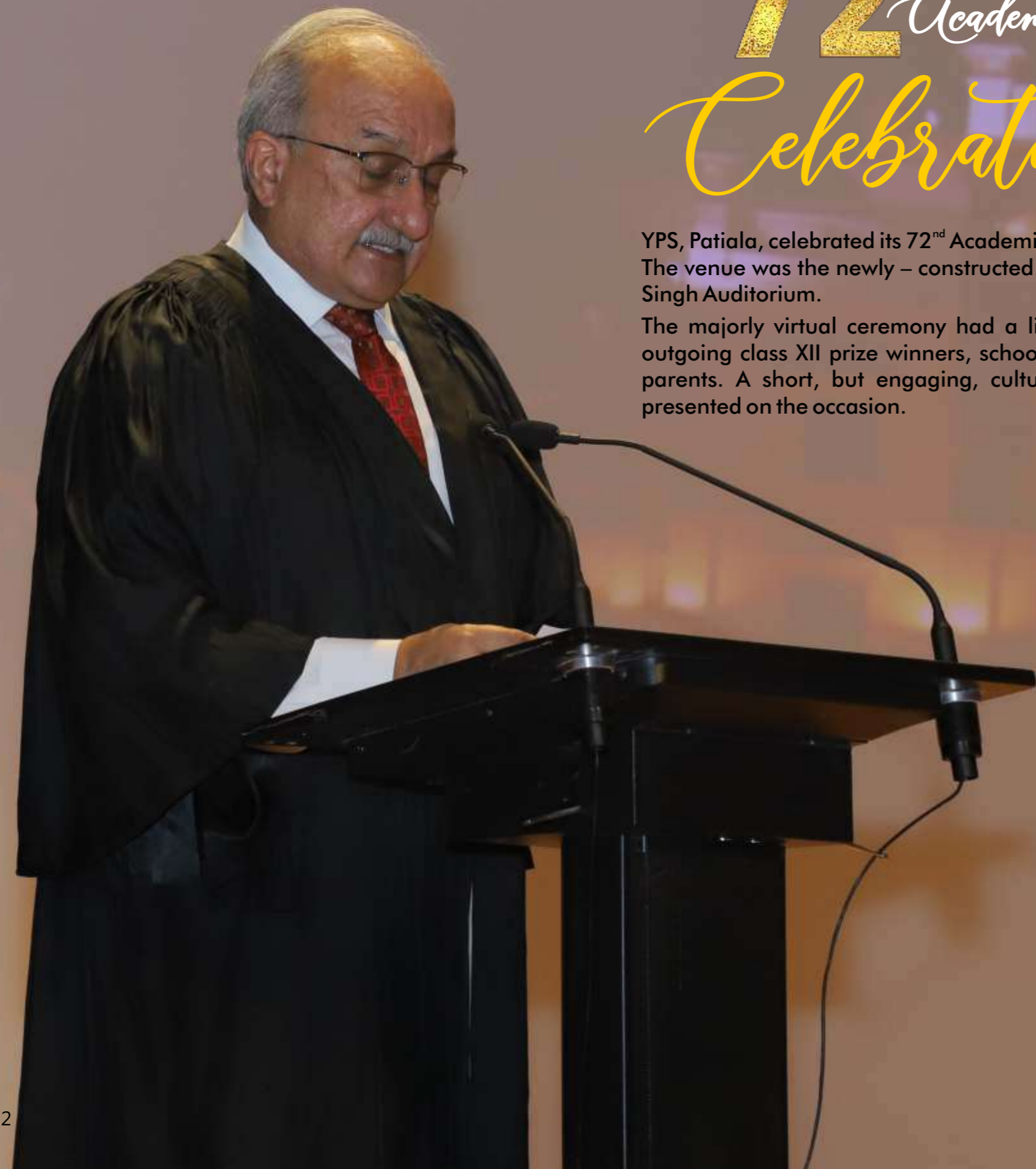


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The **72nd** Academic Day

Winds ^{Of} Change!

The last ten years have seen a number of major changes happening around our busy campus, especially in the school infrastructure. It may not be able to write about all, yet we present a few more notable ones -



RESIDENTIAL COMPLEX

A new residential block for the boarders came up in the year 2016. The block was inaugurated by the School Patron, Maharaja Captain Amarinder Singh, and stands where the Phulkian House building used to be.

The new block is a three storey building fitted with modern state-of-the-art amenities such as mechanized kitchen, bakery and launderette, a central dining hall and air conditioned dormitories.



CAPTAIN AMARINDER SINGH AUDITORIUM

One of the grandest additions to the school infrastructure is the new auditorium named after our Patron, Captain Maharaja Amarinder Singh.

The auditorium was inaugurated in the year 2020 by the Honourable Chairperson, YPS Board of Governors, Raja Malvinder Singh

The 800 seater auditorium boasts of a step system seating arrangement of plush red foldable chairs, separated by four aisles. The flooring is professionally carpeted to prevent reflecting echoes of sound. The exquisite stage is wooden, making it robust and slip resistant and is revealed and concealed by gargantuan, motorized theatre drapes. Multiple spotlights flank either side of the stage which accommodates a rear projection screen.

The building is privy to fully-equipped green rooms, gender-segregated changing rooms, a VIP lounge, an elevator and concession areas. The balconies and balustrades add to the charm of the building. A functional feature is the fire-fighting system, which has a smart smoke detecting warning system and five fire hydrants. The paintings made by students showcased inside, are a clear depiction of the kind of talent that blossoms in our school.

SQUASH COURTS

Three world class squash courts were added to the sports infrastructure four years ago. The courts named after former member of YPS Board of Governors, Raja Surendra Singh of Nalagarh, were inaugurated by Maharaja Karan Singh of Kashmir on the occasion of the School's Platinum Jubilee celebrations on February 2, 2018.



STATE-OF-THE-ART 10 LANE UNDERGROUND SHOOTING RANGE –



The shooting range complex, presently under construction, comprises of a hall-68mx27m-, a control room, a computer room, changing rooms for boys and girls, a reception lounge and an armoury. The Hall shall accommodate 10m, 25m and 50m ranges, all under one roof. This being a completely underground (indoor) shooting range (which does not exist anywhere else in India) requires special safety measures which include a firm shooting platform, rubber carpeting on the floor and rubber/wood covering on the columns.

The range is fast nearing competing and is expected to become functional and be inaugurated in July, 2022.

ARCHERY ARENA



Atop the new shooting range, a new archery arena is being built. School archers have done a commendable job over the last few years and this amenity will give them an opportunity to blossom their talent further and perform even better in the future.

The arena will be formally inaugurated along with the shooting range in July, 2022.

DEMOLITION OF THE OLD DRH BUILDING

On a nostalgic note, the demolition of the old DRH building has been an emotional moment for many-a-Yadavindrian, especially Old Yadavindrians who keep fond memories of spending time here in the old days.

But, then one should not forget, that this old, grand structure has been razed to make way for big infrastructural assets that shall be built here. These are-

50 M SWIMMING POOL

A new 50m swimming pool is being constructed at this site. This pool shall be a big improvement over the existing school swimming pool, not only in size but with other amenities such as larger sitting space for the spectators, changing rooms and a filtration plant

BASKETBALL AND VOLLEYBALL COURTS

Proposal for new basketball and volleyball courts is also in the offing which shall also stand around the same place where the DRH building stood.





CRICKET PAVILION

Yadavindrians have always held a passion for cricket and it was deemed necessary to provide these players with a cricket pavilion too, apart from the cricket grounds we have. Loosely based on the pavilion at Aitchison college, Lahore, Pakistan, the new pavilion will have a central lobby with accommodation for around 20 people, two locker rooms on either side and a viewing gallery with a seating capacity of approximately 250 people.

HOCKEY ASTRO-TURF

A new six-a-side astro-turf of the dimensions 44x27.6 m is being constructed in the vicinity of new school stables. The astro-turf will give the players a taste of professional sport and help them carry their passion for the game to newer heights

Career Counselling is an important aspect of all public school curricula these days, and so it is for YPS, Patiala. Towards this end, career counselling sessions are conducted periodically for the students of classes IX-XII. The school has a Career Desk established with a dedicated team of trained professionals to help students in Career Counselling and advancement. A trained psychologist also helps the students to conduct Psychometric Tests as per their requirements.

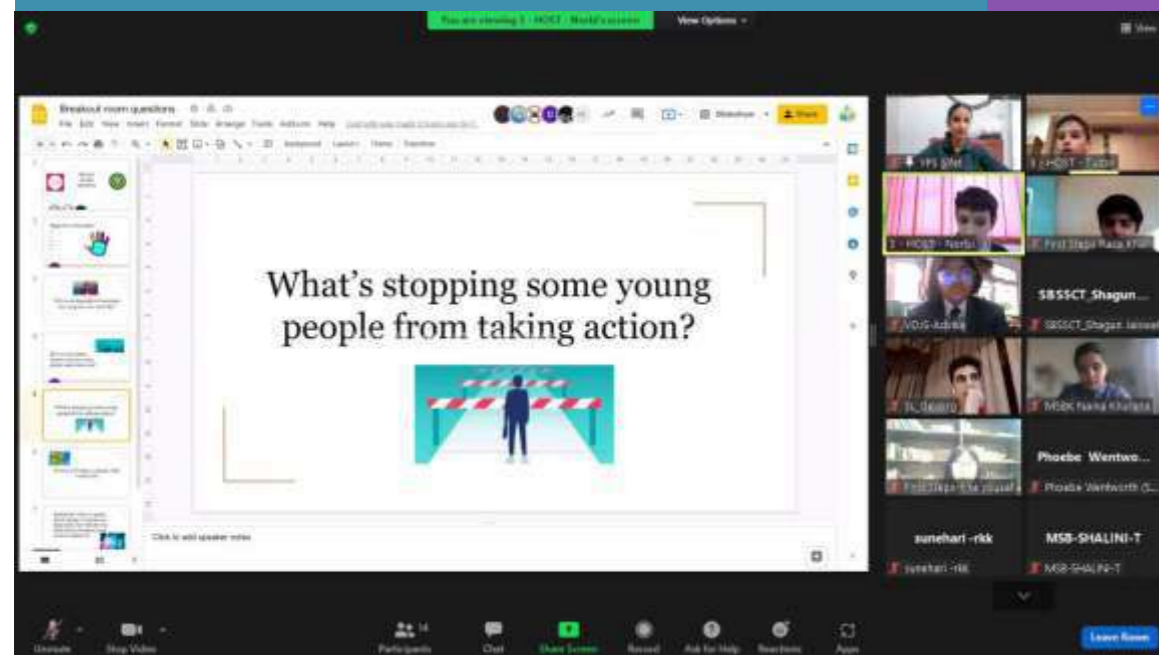

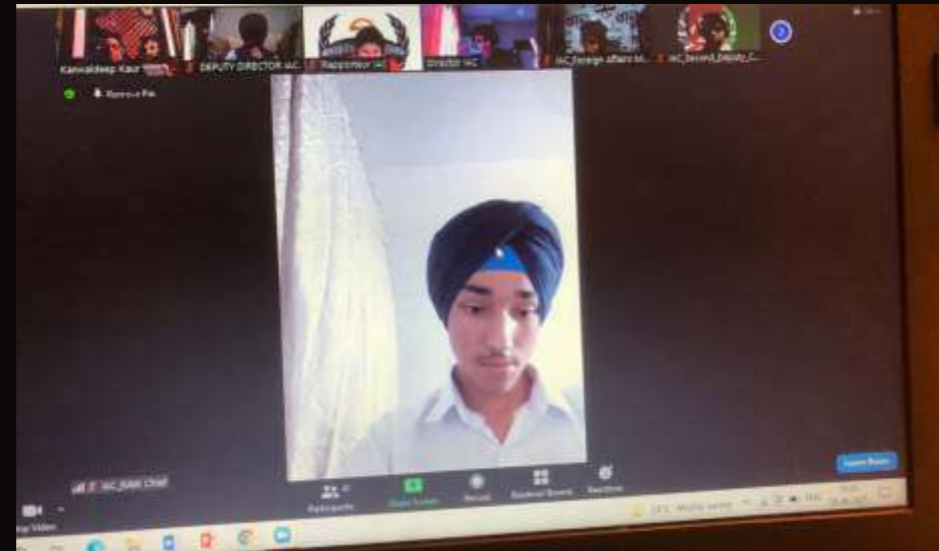
The meeting attempted to suggest ways to cope up with the mental stress and anxiety arising in the wake of the pandemic and the consequent lockdown, especially among children.

SEMESTER I

RESULTS

The students of class X performed remarkably well in the ISC and ICSE semester I examinations.

Both the results were 100% pass results.

In ISC, Jasnaaz Sidhu (Commerce) topped with 99.25%, and Yuvnoor Dhillon (Humanities) and Chaitanya Singla (Science) followed closely with 99.03% and 98% marks, respectively.

School students, under the guidance and supervision of the staff, carried out the following service activities -

1. COLLECTION AND DISTRIBUTION DRIVES -

Over a period of two months (November – December 2021) several collection and distribution drives were conducted. Students collected clothes, shoes and stationery items including books, pencil boxes, crayons, pens and pencils and distributed them to the needy students at different places through the city of Patiala, in addition to some schools in villages in proximity and also to the families of the support staff of YPS, Patiala.

2. EDUCATIONAL AND AWARENESS DRIVES-

Students interacted with the children of the YPS support staff and conducted classes for them. They helped these children understand the basic concepts of subjects like Science, Mathematics and English. The attendees were also given information on the importance of maintaining personal hygiene and benefits of healthy eating. The students conducted interactive sessions on waste segregation at source and the necessity of being responsible towards our environment.

YPS students put in a lot of sustained effort in clearing, cleaning and sprucing up the living area of the support staff, who reside within the school campus. The dumping yard near the houses was transformed into a recreational park. Initially, the waste was segregated into biodegradable and non- biodegradable categories. The area had been teeming with overgrown weeds so those were cleared off by the students. The adjoining walls were cleaned and whitewashed by the students. Thereafter, murals were painted on the walls to beautify the place. Saplings were also planted by YPS students to add to the aesthetics of the recreational area.

Residential PROJECT



IAYP student volunteers of YPS, Patiala, undertook and participated in a Residential Project conducted from 5th December to 20th December, 2021.

The project began with the IAYP Gold level participants gathering together to brainstorm project ideas. They discussed their areas of interest with the Award Leader, Mrs. Deepa Thapliyal. The mélange of ideas that were presented by the young minds possessed a common ethos-service to community. After amalgamating different propositions, the consensus was to work for the betterment of the support staff workers living inside the school campus. An area within the school campus was predetermined. This area mainly comprised of a dumping yard that was to be transformed into a recreational park. The Gold Award participants, along with the Bronze and Silver level participants, commenced cleaning the dumping ground by segregating biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes. The plan at hand was not easy to bring into fruition as efforts involved digging out the ground to uncover buried wastes, plucking wild weeds and sorting out metallic wastes. Gold Award participants exemplified leadership by coordinating the entirety of the activity and by successfully ridding the yard of its wastes in under four days.

The consequent challenge was to sensitize the residents of the area about cleanliness and hygiene. The volunteers communicated the ill-effects of the accumulated wastes to these residents, thereby educating them about methods of proper disposal of household wastes. With the goal of the creation of a park in sight, these young volunteers set out to beautify the cleaned dumping ground. As part of prepping,



the walls were scrubbed and white-washed before painting beautiful murals upon them. However, along with improving the aesthetics of the yard, there was also a moral responsibility to inculcate cleanliness cues. Some of these murals included a pristine landscape, a tree with the slogan 'Swachh Bharat', a Buddha portrait and an alien rendering the advice, 'USE THE BIN'. After watering the area, the volunteers planted saplings in the newly transformed ground and also built brick enclosures around the foot of the trees.

In a bid to make the lives of the residents better, the volunteers distributed stationery items and clothes to the underprivileged children. To boost their morale, the volunteers organized lesson in English, Art and Science for these children. Along with this, there were games played such as 'Just a Minute' that included prizes like stationery kits and books among others. The children were overjoyed to participate in such curated contests and win exciting prizes on the basis of their merit.

The Residential Project left a lasting impact on the psyche of all the Gold Award Participants. Their dedication for service was visible as they embarked on cleaning up the environment of the underprivileged stratum of the society. Being a first hand witness to the tribulations faced by these residents, the volunteers endeavoured to make the lives of these people wholesome by arranging goods for them. These acts were performed naturally out of a sense of greater good, without the desire for personal gains. The wide smiles on the innocent visages of the lesser privileged reminded us that even the simplest things in life can be a source of happiness. This proved to be the ultimate reward of the perseverance of the participants.

Well Being SESSIONS

A famous personality once said, "Overall well-being enhances intrinsic motivation, decreases discipline problems, increases academic achievement and leads to flourishing of individuals, communities and nations."

Keeping in mind the various physical, mental and emotional issues young boys and girls face in their daily lives, well-being sessions for both staff and students are now being conducted as a regular part of the school regimen.



The focus is on taking up activities that promote virtues such as gratitude, empathy, resilience, truthfulness, ambition, friendship and joy of sharing. This is being done through carefully planned activities such as card and other board games, therapeutic arts such as drawing, painting and sketching, showing short films to boost well being and educate children about various mental issues.

Special session to explain cyber security, cyber bullying, menstrual hygiene (sessions exclusively for girls) and adjustments to changes in adolescence (sessions exclusively for boys) are also being conducted.

Keeping in mind the rampant use of digital gadgets in the present times, it was extremely important for us to apprise our students of the ill effects of over usage of digital devices, as well as help them chalk out a mechanism to refrain from overusing their digital gadgets. Discussions based around some of the potential benefits and methods of digital detoxing are being emphasized upon, along with the importance of engagement in the activities such as reading, dancing, painting etc. to help divert their minds from digital applications. The importance of physical fitness, mental fitness and development of social skills is being emphasized and children are being asked to give more importance to their health, eye sight and sleeping patterns.

These sessions were engaging and left a positive impact on the minds of the students.

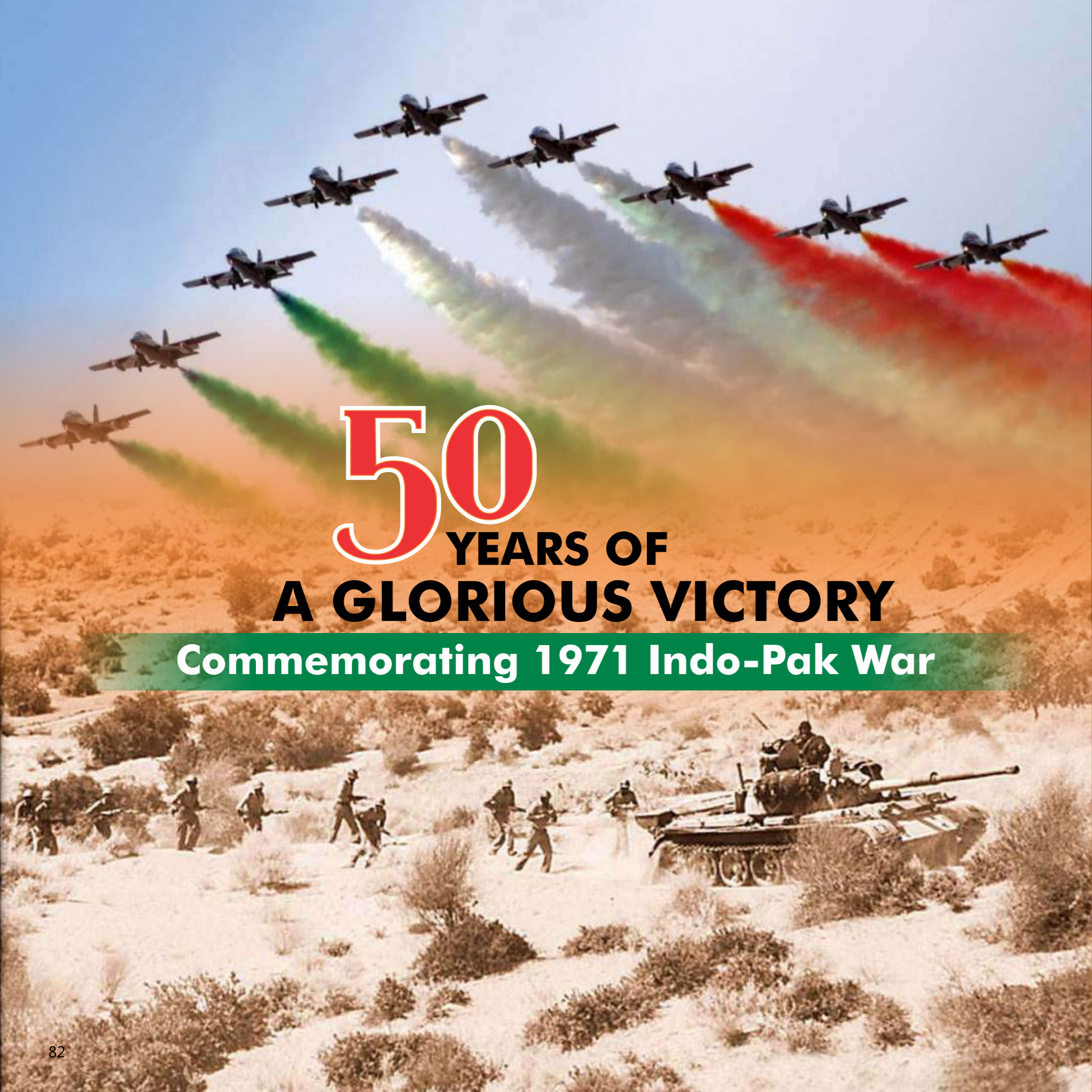

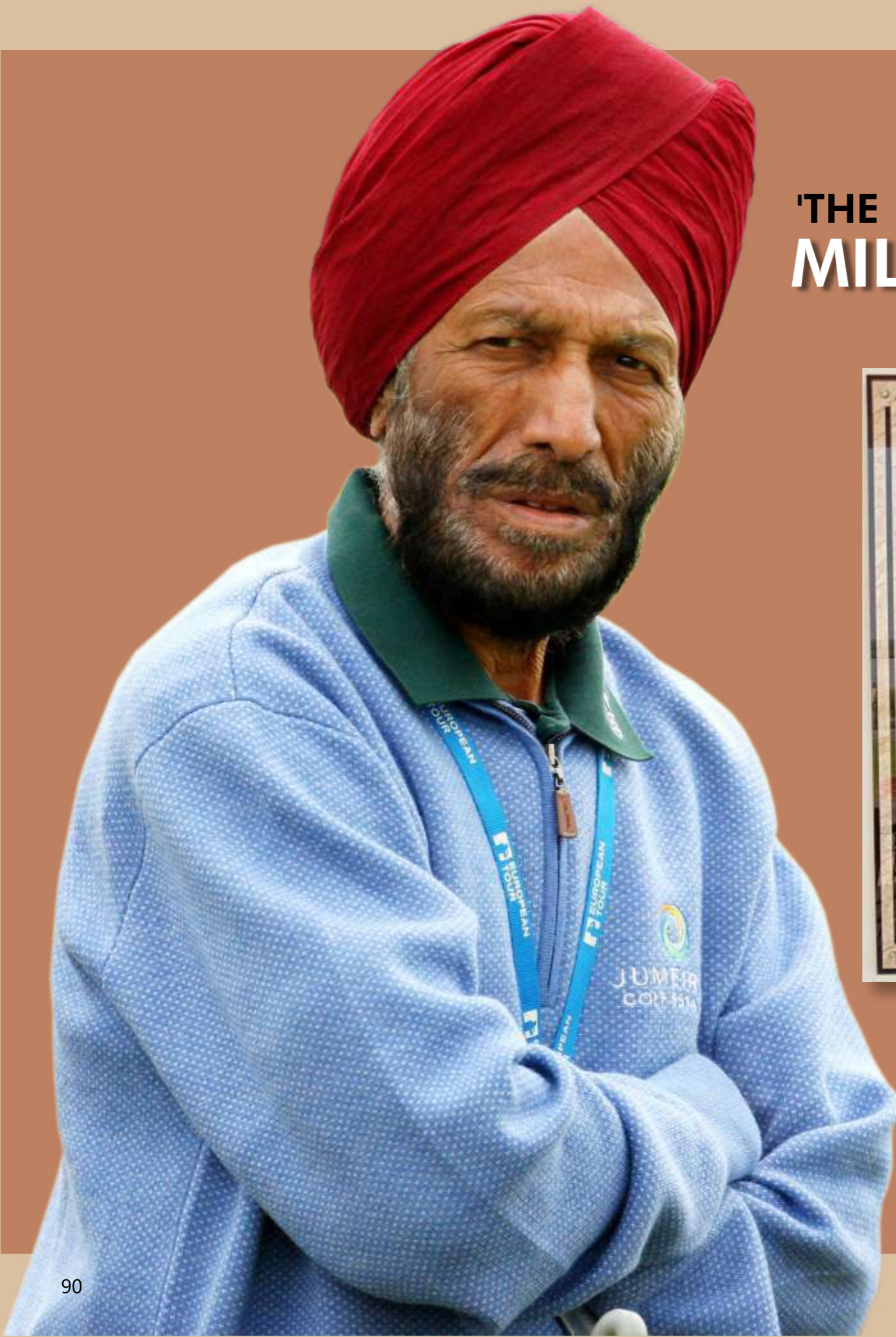

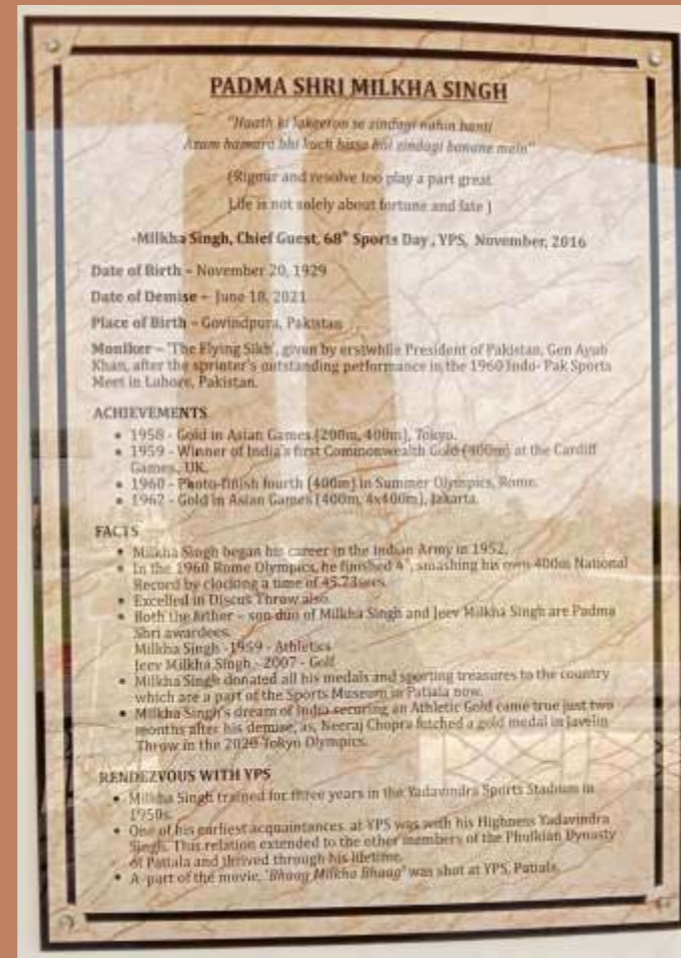
CYCLE RALLIES

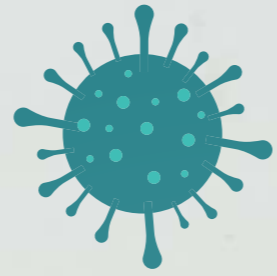

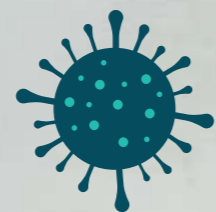

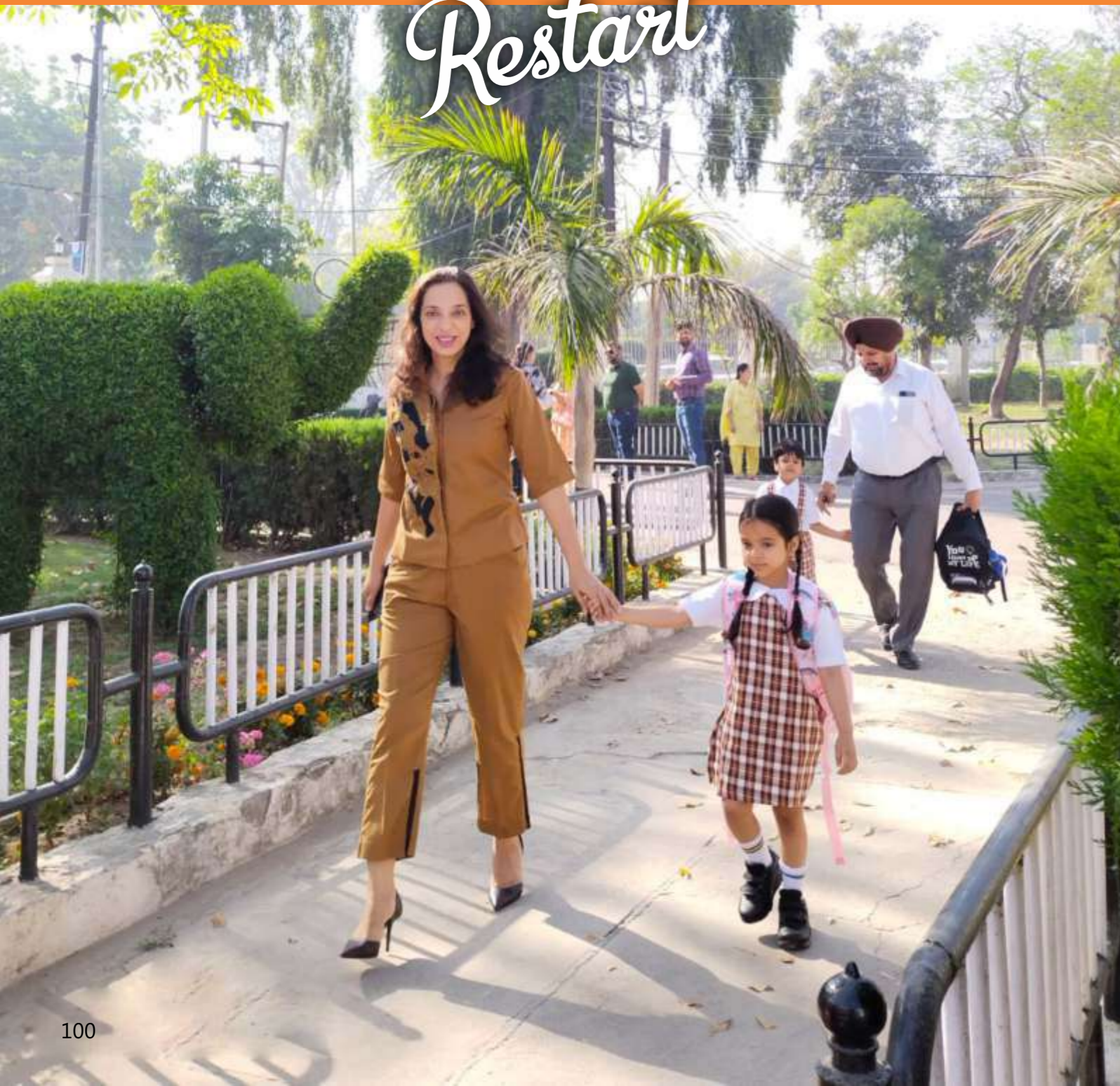

THE FOUNDATION

Restart



The Kindergarten preschools of India, for many years did not have formal directives and did not require any form of affiliation to any particular school. Thus such schools were never mandatory, but were highly preferred. The year 2020, saw the first draft of the much awaited New Education Policy (NEP) which emphasized the criticality of the early years of child learning and the aims to ensure quality early childhood care and education for all children between the ages 3-8 by the year 2025. With such policy at hand, YPS, Patiala, planned its first ever

Nursery to class II Foundation Classes formerly termed as “**The Foundation**”.

Going by the government guidelines and investing heavily on the upgradation of the present infrastructure, YPS started the rigorous process of appointing skilled staff. A total of 12 staff members presently form the Foundation Wing faculty.

The Foundation then started its work on an all new developmentally - appropriate infrastructure. Equal emphasis on art, languages, sports, numeracy, social sciences and environmental sciences with the integration of regular subjects was planned. YPS started with its upgraded and newly designed curriculum and pedagogical structure with a new set of ideas.

The Foundation now comprises of the Nursery, Prep. I, Prep. II, Class I and Class II

On 6th April, 2022, we observed the commencement of this section with cheerful, active toddlers buzzing around the Kindergarten Block. Kids were seen enjoying their all new upgraded infrastructures and sitting in their bright newly painted classrooms. The bubbly and exuberant voices of the children playing, dancing and chatting with their peers made the four walls of our preschool come to life.

Further, keeping the teacher- student ratio of 1:20 in mind, we started our Foundation wing with a total of 312 students aging from 3 to 8 years.

We aim at helping the child's transition from home to school environment. Here they are moulded through a number of games and activities such as drawing, singing and dancing. Such fun games help develop a child's motor skills, love for learning and building communications through socio-emotional skills. The teaching learning environment here is inherently interpersonal, encompassing both teacher-student and peer connection, thereby facilitating healthy social-emotional development of students. Pro-social behaviour in young children contributes to school readiness, perspective talking, empathy, self-regulation, attention to instructions and good observational skills. The numerous activities, stories, puzzles and brain gyms encourage children to explore their environment in a fun way.

This year has started with a new joy and enthusiasm and we hope to move a step forward with each passing year to create a more holistic, happier and healthier environment.
